IRAs and HSAs

You still have time to put money into an IRA and or HSA for 2022 if you haven't done so already. For most IRAs and HSAs, the 2022 contribution deadline is the same day income taxes are due, which is **April 18**, 2023 this year. When depositing to your IRA or HSA please make sure to let us know which tax year you are depositing for.

The maximum contribution limit for IRAs are: for the 2022 tax year \$6,000.00 and if you are 50 years old or older you may contribute and additional \$1,000.00 for a total of \$7,000.00.

For the 2023 tax year the maximum IRA contribution limits are \$6,500.00 and if you are 50 years old or older you may contribute and additional \$1,000.00 for a total of \$7,500.00.

If you have a Traditional or Roth IRA, the contributions must be made from taxable or earned wages. Earned income is from employment— wages, salaries, commissions, tips, and bonuses. If you're self-employed, you may contribute compensation from your business' net earnings.

You are **not** allowed to contribute to a Traditional or Roth IRA using income from types of investments such as rental property or interest income. Dividends, pension income, annuity income, and deferred compensation benefits are also not eligible for IRA contributions.

HSAs

For the tax year 2022, if you have an HDHP (High Deductible Health Plan), you can contribute up to \$3,650 for self-only coverage and up to \$7,300 for family coverage into an HSA. For the tax year 2023 you can contribute \$3,850.00 for self-only coverage and \$7,750.00 for family coverage. HSA funds roll over year to year if you don't spend them. If you're 55 or older at the end of the tax year, you can put in an extra \$1,000 in "catch up" contributions for both 2022 and 2023.

Your contribution limit is reduced by the amount of any contributions made by your employer that are excludable from your income, including amounts contributed to your HSA account through a cafeteria plan.

Please consult your tax preparer with any questions on your eligibility, limits and benefits of contributing to an IRA or HSA.

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$6.52 and sovbeans are \$14.52. Corn is ■ \$.26 higher and soybeans are \$.27 higher than one month ago. March corn futures are \$6.83 with support at \$6.73 and then at \$6.55, resistance is at \$6.91 and then at \$7.10, March soybean futures are \$15.32 with support at \$15.21 and then at \$14.92, resistance is at \$15.49 and then at \$15.78. The January USDA crop report was a friendly surprise for the ■ bulls. US corn production was cut by ■ 200 million bushels and soybean production was cut by 70 million bushels. This was offset by corn usage being cut by 185 million bushels and 59 million bushels of soybeans. High prices is cutting both domestic usage and exports. The US continues to lose export share due to high prices. The report is likely a short term game changer if further weather issues don't affect world production. A supporting example for this is corn exports are currently down 47% from a year ago

versus USDA forecasting only a 22% decline for the year. Argentina's production was cut due to weather issues, but declines were overshadowed by significantly increased acres and yields projecting a large crop in Brazil. To put this into perspective Brazil's soybean exports this year are expected to be 3.343 billion bushels versus 1.990 billion bushels for the US. For corn expected export for Brazil this year is 1.85 billion bushels versus 1.925 billion bushels from the US. The report gave Cash hogs are \$56, down \$2 from last life for bulls. However we are still in a month. trading range for the next couple of months. September corn is \$6.17 and has major support at \$6.00 and resistance at \$6.40. A close under \$6.00 would likely set up a move below \$5.80. November soybeans are \$13.86 within a range of \$13.80 and \$14.25. The next couple of months are likely going to be a wild market with plenty of volatility. Continue to make sales in increments at these profitable levels.
