

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.10 and soybeans are \$9.10. Corn is \$.37 higher and sovbeans are \$.01 lower than two months ago. March corn futures are \$4.42 with support at \$4.40 and then at \$4.38, resistance is at \$4.46 and then ■ at \$4.49. January soybean futures are \$9.60 with support at \$9.69 and then at \$9.62, resistance is at \$9.85 and then at \$9.93. Last week's December USDA crop report which is usually non eventful was positive for corn. USDA increased ethanol usage to 5.50 billion from 5.45 billion bushels. Exports increased to ■ 2.475 billion from 2.325 billion with feed usage staying steady. Carryover dropped from 1.938 to 1.738 billion bushel and stocks-to-usage ratio from 13% to 11.4%.

Stocks-to-usage was at 15% not that long ago. USDA still estimates average price for corn at \$4.10 which probably should go up some with more usage and lower stocks. World corn stocks outside of China continued to shrink. down 5.8% to 5.69 MMT. **USDA** raised world soybean ending stocks for 2024/25 to 131.87 MMT, up 17.6% from last year, which is record high. Summing up things, corn usage is growing due to base building as a result of lower prices. Basis has been strong to pry open farmers bin doors, but expect that to narrow back up as more corn hits the market as cash needs increase in the new year. As for soybeans without serious weather issues threatening South America's crop soybeans will struggle to move much higher due to plentiful world supplies. Additionally traders will be

looking for news on US-China trade relations over the next several weeks.


