Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.56 and soybeans are \$12.70. Corn is \$.03 higher and soybeans are \$.30 lower than one month ago. March corn futures are \$4.75 with support at \$4.74 and then at \$4.66, resistance is at \$4.81 and then at \$4.88. ■ January soybean futures are \$13.18 with support at \$13.13 and then at ■ \$12.92, resistance is at \$13.34 and then at \$13.55. USDA'S December world Supply and Demand report showed few changes. Currently the world corn balance sheet now calls for world corn production to rebound by 5.6% this year to a record level. ■ World consumption is predicted to rise 3.3% this year. World corn ending stocks are expected to rise by more than 15 million metric tons or 5% with ending stocks/use ratio

rising to 26.3%, with 64% of that in

China. Since we can't verify that amount the stocks/use ratio for the world minus China is 12.5%. World soybean supply/demand for 2023/24 remains record large with projected 2023/24 ending stocks of 29.7%. This is the second largest on record behind 2018/19 at 33.0%. Last year we had an inverted market with no carry. That meant grain companies and elevators wanted to move the grain right away as they couldn't make money storing grain and would lose money if they did. With carry they want to store so basis is better now than it will be once the grain starts to move. If this carry continues and grain doesn't start moving faster there will be lots of grain trying to move once we get to May and June putting pressure on prices and the transportation system. Corn demand for ethanol and exports has been good recently. As we approach year end holiday futures trade

volume typically gets lighter and can cause some unusual market moves so put in your grain orders to sell in case the market moves.
