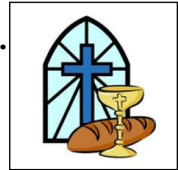

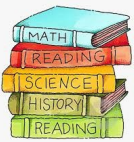

As of this writing, cash corn is \$6.67 and soybeans are \$14.23. Corn is \$.32 higher and soybeans are \$1.19 higher than one month ago. September corn futures are \$5.93 with support at \$5.76 and then at \$5.50, resistance is at \$6.03 and then at \$6.29. August soybean futures are \$14.23 with support at \$13.79 and then at \$13.29, resistance is at \$14.25 and then at \$14.73. As I write this the market is still up with no significant rain or anything significant in the forecast 1-2 weeks out. The weather reversal of the last 2 weeks has been more dramatic than we've seen for several years. Keep in mind markets always fall faster than they go up. USDA will make acreage adjustments in the June 30 Planted Acreage Report. The USDA had a fairly high projected national yield which the market has discounted with rallies in both corn and soybeans. Along with planted acreage on June 30 USDA will release quarterly grain stocks.

The March-May quarter continued to see low exports for corn, soybeans and wheat as U.S. prices haven't been competitive in the world market. The one bright spot has been strong domestic demand for soybeans to crush. We hear talk about grain production in the 1 states but 5 states account for approximately 60% of total U.S. production. Weather problems in the states of Iowa, Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota and Indiana are far more impacting than smaller states. Another factor in grain production numbers are they reflect harvested grain not harvested as silage for feed. Wisconsin typically harvested only 76.5% of it's corn as grain versus Illinois at 98.2%. As you have already guessed there are many factors in the next 2 weeks to move the market. It will most certainly be a wild ride over the next 30 days which no one can predict today. Clean up old crop if you

haven't and make small sales on rallies so you don't strike out swinging for a homerun.
