

# Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$6.35 and soybeans are \$13.04. Corn is \$.10 lower and soybeans are \$1.46 lower than one month ago. July corn futures are \$6.04 with support at \$5.92 and then at \$5.74. July soybean futures are \$13.37 with support at \$13.25 and then at \$13.03, resistance is at \$13.46 and then at \$13.68. This week, before Memorial Day weekend, July corn futures closed \$.50 higher and July soybeans \$.30 higher on drier forecasts for the corn belt. This action put a short team bottom in the markets following a spring with minimal planting issues as the market sees it except the farthest northern parts of the country. This reversal follows a \$1.20 drop in December corn futures and \$2.30 drop in November soybean futures from the first of the year. Weather forecasts currently are for above average temperatures and below average rains in the midwest for the next two weeks.

Not a problem right now but futures markets are forward looking when it comes to weather forecasts. Unless the weather would turn into a 1988 or 2012 type of drought any rally likely will be over before July 4th with world stocks currently projected to increase and our demand dropping. Selling is tough to do with lower prices than a year ago and drier weather but rallies need to be used as sales opportunities.


