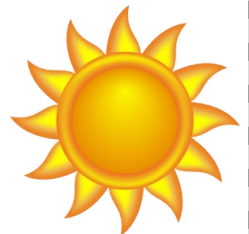

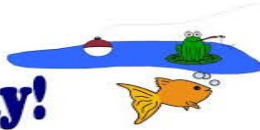

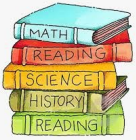

**20th Annual Elma Trail Days 5K/10K Run/Walk
Saturday, July 11, 2026 7:30 a.m.**

Join us on one of the fastest, "funnest" and most scenic courses in Northeast Iowa! This year, the 20th Annual Elma Trail Days will be offering both a 5k and 10k race beginning at 7:30 a.m. 5k participants will be shuttled out to Lylah's Marsh to start their race. 10k participants will start in Elma at the finish line, run out to Lylah's Marsh, turn around, and run back into Elma. The event follows the Old Roundhouse and Wapel Great Western Line Trail, and concludes just north of the water tower in Elma. 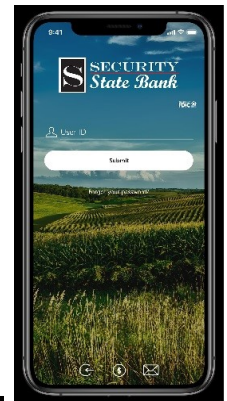

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.08 and cash soybeans are \$10.98. Corn is \$.12 higher and soybeans \$.51 higher than two months ago. May corn futures are \$4.48 with support at \$4.44 and then at \$4.39, resistance is at \$4.52 and then at \$4.55. May soybean futures are \$11.67 with support at \$11.56 and then at \$11.46, resistance is at \$11.72 and then at \$11.78. The grain markets have moved up slightly in the last 2 months. The markets appear to be waiting on this springs planted acres and the outcome of a US-China meeting. The US is the largest producer of corn in the world so US fundamentals dominate worldwide fundamentals and prices. Brazil dominates as the worlds clargest producer and China dominates on the soybean

cdemand side. Brazil produc-
es 42% of the world soybeans.
China uses 31% of global soy-
bean production and 60% of
global imports, with the next
largest importer being the EU
(a group of countries) at 8%
of global imports. Current
estimated planted soybean
acreage of 84.7 million acres
versus 81.2 last year puts
projected carryover at 437
million bushels versus this
year's 345 million bushels.
With more carryout you would
assume slightly lower prices
next year. You can make the
same reverse assumption for
corn except corn carryout is
still plenty high and much
more price improvement will
be hard to get. Consider
spring planting weather,
increasing input costs.
US-China relations, the
conflict with Iran and South
America crops and weather if
your not confused about
priced direction let me borrow

your crystal ball or at least
show me how you
think the dust will settle over
the next 2 to 12 months. I
think this is a time to make
small sales and have price
protection not take big risks
but time will tell.
