

and then follow the directions that are displayed. This process is known as provisioning. Once you are approved you may begin using your digital wallet.

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$3.73 and soybeans are \$9.11. Corn is \$.11 higher and soybeans are \$.18 lower than two months ago. December corn futures are \$4.05 with support at \$4.02 and then at \$3.96, resistance is at \$4.08 and then at \$4.14. November sovbean futures are \$9.73 with support at \$9.61 and then at \$9.34. resistance is at \$9.87 and then at \$10.13. October is normally a month of volatile for corn and soybean prices due to harvest pressure. This year is no exception with dry weather speeding harvest along in most of the US. At this time it appears a harvest low in prices has been set. December corn futures rallied from \$4.02 on September 23 to \$4.34 on October 1 and then dropped to \$3.99 on October 17th. The market then completed a key reversal up on that day. Since

the middle of August, November soybean futures have rallied from \$9.55 to \$10.69 on September 30 and then dropped to \$9.68 on October 17. October is also a time of the year the market is watching South American's weather. They had been dry but received some significant rain recently, with more expected putting pressure on the grain markets. Fundamentally what can drive prices to the upside going forward? The law of ecomomics still work, low prices increase demand . Corn usage goes up when the price is under \$4.00 just like it goes down at \$8.00. In a down market like we have had the last 2 years buyers buy hand to mouth only covering todays needs. Once prices bottom they will begin to build back inventory. At the lows worldwide planted

acreage goes down slightly just as it goes higher at high prices. Be safe with the rest of harvest.


