Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.66 and soybeans are \$12.43. Corn is \$.21 higher and soybeans are \$.04 higher than one month ago. December corn futures are \$4.90 with support at \$4.88 and then at \$4.81. resistance is at \$4.94 and then at \$5.01. November soybean futures are \$12.86 with support at \$12.80 and then at \$12.62, resistance is at \$12.98 and then at \$13.16. Corn futures broke above resistance last Thursday with December trading over \$5 before hitting selling pressure due to profit taking going into the weekend. Without major changes in the news, a slow continued pattern of grinding higher will continue as harvest winds down and farmer selling remains slow. November soybeans posted a strong rally last week, closing the week above \$13. Basis levels across the Midwest continue to tighten as farmers put beans in bins and wait to see what happens.

Spring crop insurance prices were set last February for corn at \$5.91 and soybeans at \$13.76. As of Friday the 20th close, current month to date average for December corn is \$4.92 and November soybeans are \$12.83. We still have 7 more trading days to average in before the final fall prices are set. Once U.S. harvest wraps up South American weather will again be the major market factor. Brazil's agriculture industry continues to grow rapidly. Years ago it surpassed the U.S. as the largest soybean exporter and is set to pass the U.S. in corn and cotton exports also this year. South American production is increasingly important for global corn and soybean markets and overall mostly bearish for U.S. prices as they can supply more and more of the world demand the U.S. previously did.
