



Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$3.69 and cash soybeans are \$9.35. Corn is \$.15 higher and soybeans are \$.21 lower than two months ago. December corn futures are \$4.10 with support at \$4.09 and then at \$4.16. November soybean futures are \$10.07 with support at \$10.02 and then at \$9.97. resistance is at \$10.12 and then ■ at \$9.97, resistance is at \$10.12 and then at \$10.17. The corn and soybean markets held up pretty well considering we are in the midst of harvest pressure until last Friday as hopes for a trade deal with China faded. For corn the market will need time to build a base before moving higher. One positive is corn exports are off ■ to a very strong start and could very well exceed 3 billion bushels this year. Technically, December corn futures traded

into a July 4th gap and moved

into a down trend. It appears likely a long-term low in the market has been made. However, the short-term picture doesn't look very good. The corn market currently appears similar to last year. We had a multi-week sell off before moving higher into February. Yield reports from the Midwest and throughout lowa appear variable. Too much early season rain has lead to smaller ears in some areas as well as more rust and other diseases than normal in other areas. US soybean exports have been lower to date. The main reason is the missing exports to China as Brazil's soybean exports to China hit all time record highs. Technically, the soybean market has been in a sideways range for 13 months. Several sell offs in the November contract have found support at \$10, with only a few weekly closes under \$10. Futures will have a tough time getting to

\$10.75 which is major resistance without any progress in the China trade negotiations. If beans do gain some upward momentum a .\$50 move is quite possible but also a selling opportunity.
