

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.45 and soybeans are \$12.39. Corn is \$.84 lower and soybeans are \$1.39 lower than one month ago. December corn futures are \$4.77 with support at \$4.74 and then at \$4.70. resistance is at \$4.79 and then at \$4.83. November soybean futures ■ are \$12.96 with support at \$12.91 and then at \$12.81, resistance is at \$13.02 and then at \$13.12. As you noticed cash corn and soybean prices are down from a month ago. End users have enough supplies until new crop harvest is in full swing and took away any premium they had been giving. USDA will release it's last quarterly Grain Stocks report next Friday. I'm not expecting any significant revisions to 2022 production, we'll see if they just make minor adjustments. The market is expecting a modest increase in old crop corn ending stock compared to a year ago, tight U.S. soybean stocks

and relatively comfortable U.S wheat

'22 had a lot of outside money invested in them looking for a return when interest rates where at historic lows. Now that interest rates are higher, that money has left commodities and isn't likely to come back to the commodity markets, with many other options to earn a return on their money. I don't believe interest rates will be dropping anytime soon. When you look at long term interest rate charts the current higher rates are about average, with the lower rates from 2008 to 2022 being the unusual low, with only the 1930's being close. November soybean futures are trading at an \$8.19 premium to December corn futures. In June that same premium was only \$6.24. Historically the current premium could get bigger but not for long as it normally will be cut by 40-50% within a year of peaking. Right now everyone is bullish soybeans on prospects of renewable diesel. Tops are made on bullish news never bearish news. The spread also can narrow with corn

stocks. The Grain markets in '21 and futures rising. Demand will hopefully start to rebuild with current \$4.xx prices. Until we confirm a harvest low, grain prices will experience weakness.
