

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.09 and cash soybeans are \$9.93. Corn is \$.46 lower and soybeans are \$.16 higher than two months ago. July corn futures are \$4.34 with support at \$4.28 and then at \$4.22, resistance is at \$4.43 and then at \$4.52. July soybean futures are \$10.71 with support at \$10.62 and then at \$10.56. resistance is at \$10.77 and then at \$10.86. USDA's monthly report last Thursday raised export forecasts of corn by 50 million bushels which cut carryout below 1.4 billion bushels. That carryout is small enough to make newcrop corn sensitive to Midwest weather concerns if they develop. USDA made no changes to soybean balance

sheets. Without a weather scare the expectation of harvesting 87.1 million acres of corn and 1.4 billion bushel carryover has fundamentals leaning bearish. Soybeans on the other hand could be viewed as under priced due to planted acreage sharply lower than last year and supplies tighter than last year. Weather issues could send soybeans to new highs. Last Friday soybean oil demand went up tied to Federal biofuel blending requirement changes which were favorable to renewable diesel and soybeans.
