Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$7.81 ■ and soybeans are \$16.22. Corn is ■ \$.19 higher and soybeans are \$.05 higher than one month ago. July corn futures are \$8.09 with support at \$7.98 and then at \$7.80, resistance is at \$8.15 and then at \$8.33. July soybean futures are \$16.56 with support at \$16.48 and then at \$16.30, resistance is at \$16.66 and then at \$16.84. Last Thursday the May USDA supply/demand report held a few big surprises. Rarely done in the May report, projected corn yields were ■ lowered from 181 to 177. USDA made its first estimate of the Ukraine situation: Corn production was put at 19.5 mmt, down 54% from last years 42.1 mmt, and exports are forecast to be down 73%. USDA lowered US corn export with the assumption the US will not pick up Ukraine's last exports. Soybean carryover supplies ■ for 2021/22 were lowered 25 million bushels, to 235 million, with 2022/23

carryover at 310 million bushels. The market is now trading weather once again. Weather will be critical from now until the second week in August. Prices will stay volatile for the summer. Other big news last week was Russia shutting down the natural gas pipeline running thru Ukraine to Europe, moving energy prices sharply higher again. Energy remains the number one inflationary item. If energy prices continue up then inflation will as well, leaving the Fed no choice but to raise interest rates until energy costs go down.


