Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.20 and soybeans are \$11.36. Corn is \$.11 lower and soybeans are \$.29 lower than one month ago. March corn futures are \$4.30 with support at \$4.28 and then at \$4.22, resistance is at \$4.34 and then at \$4.40. March soybean futures are \$11.86 with support at \$11.80 and then at \$11.65, resistance is at \$11.94 and then \$12.09. Some takeaways from last Thursday's USDA Supply and Demand report: 1) The sharp increase in soybean carryover supplies for the US and world. USDA increased projected US soybean carryover by 35 million bushels up to ■ 315 million bushels, compared to 264

million last year. World carryover increased by 116 million metric tons from 103.5 last year, and 98 in 2021/2022. 2) US corn carryout increased 10 million bushels from January to 2.17 billion bushels, compared to 1.36 billion bushels last year. 3) We continue to shift the export market to Brazil and South America. Today Commercial companies are long and adding more to their long position while commodity funds continue increasing a large short position. Historically commercials tend to be correct verses commodity funds but we need some positive news to put a bottom in the markets. We are less than one month away from planting in the South. The market focus then will be on weather. The trade expects some

acreage shift from corn to soybeans and corn to cotton in the south due to better profit opportunities than corn.
