### **Corn and Beans**

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.33 and soybeans are \$10.99. Corn is \$.13 higher and soybeans are \$.37 lower than one month ago. May corn futures are \$4.27 with support at \$4.25 and then at \$4.20, resistance is at \$4.29 and then at \$4.34. May soybean futures are \$11.34 with support at \$11.28 and then at \$11.11, resistance is at \$11.45 and then at ■ \$11.61. We continue to stay in the same trading ranges for corn and soybeans since the April USDA report was just a number of minor changes. The U.S. and world stocks -to-usage ratios continue to build an already adequate supplies. South

American crops currently seem to be better than anticipated this winter and continue to put more pressure on U.S. exports. It appears thoughts of an early spring are giving way to a normal spring as cooler and wetter weather shift back to a more normal pattern. All signs point to the end of El Nino after it caused a historically warm winter and the start of La Nina. The National Weather Service's **Climate Prediction Center estimates** an 85% chance of El Nino to neutral pattern by April-June and 60% odds of La Nina developing by June-August. La Nina arriving by summer would favor a warm, dry summer across much of the corn belt. It is far from a sure timeline. If La Nina wouldn't arrive until late summer,

dry weathers effect on crop yields would be very minimal. Unless we have significant planting and/or yield issues price rallies are going to be very limited due to stocks-to-usage numbers in the U.S. and world.
