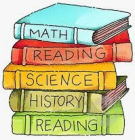

Corn and Beans

As of this writing, cash corn is \$4.55 and cash soybeans are \$9.77. Corn is \$.13 lower and soybeans are \$.07 higher than two months ago. May corn futures are \$4.85 with support at \$4.80 and then at \$4.75, resistance is at \$4.87 and then at \$4.91. May soybean futures are \$10.34 with support at \$10.29 and then at \$10.19, resistance is at \$10.47 and then at \$10.55. April typically is not a good month for making grain marketing decisions, to purchase or sell. So far April is mixed with a lot of volatility and high emotions. The March 31st quarterly Grain Stocks report had no surprises. US corn stocks are 8.151 billion bushels, 2.4 % below a year ago and still the

2nd largest in the past six years. As of March 1st on farm corn stocks totaled 4.5 billion bushels, down 12.9% from one year ago. Off-farm stocks totaled 3.651 billion bushels, up 11.6% from one year ago. The market feels corn stocks are in stronger hands than 1 year ago. This should help support prices and basis levels in corn-deficit areas. World wide corn fundamentals are bullish as supplies continue to drop. Large expected US planted acreage currently holds upward pressure on corn while tightening world stocks provide downward support. \$5 resistance is psychologically significant and would take some fairly bullish news to move above the \$5 resistance. If May soybean futures can get thru \$10.50 a rally to \$10.75-\$10.80 area is

likely.

Be safe this spring planting season.
