
#### ATTENTION PEOPLES SAVINGS BANK CUSTOMERS...

## **Corn and Beans**

As of this writing, cash corn is \$6.50 and soybeans are \$13.18. Corn is \$.05 higher and soybeans are \$.82 Iower than one month ago. December corn futures are \$6.84 with support at \$6.78 and then \$6.68, resistance is at \$6.88 and then at \$6.99. November soybean futures are \$13.95 with support at \$13.81 and then at \$13.58, resistance is at \$14.04 and then at \$14.27. Over the last 50 years we've gone through at least 5 bull to bear cycles. No one knows for sure when the market will switch. We have been in a bull market for 2 years now so it could be anytime. The main reason corn has moved this high is tight supplies. Tight supplies will also cause volatile prices for the next

couple of years. Any problems on the supply side from weather or the war in Ukrain will cause prices to move up. Absent problems the threat Cash cattle are \$148, up \$3 from last of a economic recession threatens to slow demand. Nothing new so what's my point? In challenging markets reward rallies, sell in increments, and don't expect to hit a home run. Don't Cash hogs are \$73, down \$1 from last be too hard on yourself just keep looking forward and making sales. It will be your average sales price that matters not your best or worst sale.
