ELMA COMMUNITY COMPLEX UPDATE

The Elma Community Complex (ECC) is making great progress but is not finished yet!

Library- The library has moved but is still settling into the new space. The library is in need of furniture, technology installation and office equipment to resume full services.



Daycare-Flooring and cabinets are installed into the new daycare addition and they hope to move in soon. This new addition will expand the capacity of

our community's non-profit daycare. Once the infants are moved into this new room then the existing infant room will get updated with new carpet and paint and will become the



preschool room. The existing toddler room will also get new carpet and paint as well. The daycare also needs to complete the outdoor play area.

City Clerk's Office-Construction is now complete and we are just waiting for the cabinets to be installed. Shannon hopes to move into her new office soon!

Entrances and parking lots on the east and south side of the ECC will be added along with updates to the exterior portion of the building. The murals from the


former school building will be incorporated into the exterior of the building. There are also plans to remodel the bathrooms in the hallway of the ECC.

An estimated \$72,000 is needed complete all phases of the project. There are several ways to support the project:

-Cash donations or IRA distributions are also welcome. These donations can be mailed to Elma Community Complex, City of Elma, PO Box 497, Elma IA 50628.



Corn and Beans As of this writing, cash corn is \$6.45 and soybeans are \$14.00. Corn is \$.25 lower and soybeans are \$.43 lower than one month ago. December corn futures are \$6.85 with support at \$6.77 and then at \$6.57, resistance is at \$6.96 and then at \$7.15. November soybean futures are \$14.65 with support at \$14.50 and then at \$14.21, resistance is at \$14.80 and then at \$15.09. Last week's USDA report lowered expected crop yields from August's report, which is considered long-term bullish. Harvested acres were lowered and probably the biggest surprise in the report. Harvested corn acres were down 1.2 million acres and harvested soybean acres dropped 600,000 acres. USDA projected lower exports and domestic consumption. Ending stocks continue to be very tight after the changes. Planting estimates have South America planting pace similar to last year. Friday's Commitments of Traders report shows funds long 241,000 contracts of corn, up 15,000 Iast week. Soybeans are long 113,000 contracts up 14,000 last week. If you combine all 3 wheat contracts, funds are short 5,000 contracts, down 6,000

from last week. The US dollar charted a new 20 year high overnight on support the Fed is likely to continue raising interest rates aggressively later this year. The Swiss National bank announced a 0.75% rate hike, ending negative interest rates in Europe. Ukraine has taken back another large area from Russia. Putin pushed back threatening to escalate with nuclear weapons threat again and criticizing the grain export deal made in August. Putin claims Ukraine shipments to wealthy European neighbors rather than poorer countries in Africa. The original deal expires in November and will need to be rewritten. Tight ending stocks remain long term bullish while all the things I just wrote about lead to volatility for grain prices for some time. The good news for us is most yields in our area appear to be good. Yields and current prices should give most of us a profitable crop right now. Next years inputs continue to move higher which will put us into a loss position sometime in the future. Not new news to any one, right? Let's not try to hit the high with grain sales but rather follow your marketing plan making multiple small sales and don't let the current profit get away if something causes -----

the markets to drop outside of the trading ranges. Hopefully that will help take some of the stress out of sales in these volatile times. The harvest is off to a later start this year, remember to take breaks and have a safe harvest.



The renovation to house the ambulances and full-time staff at the Elma Fire Station has been completed! Work on Phase II of the project will begin shortly. We need to add additional bays to the south of the firehouse to gain the space back that was utilized for the ambulances (Phase I).

Due to fluctuating prices of materials along with unforeseen renovation costs, the projected budget had to be increased. We are looking to raise an additional \$200,000.

Recently, the Elma Emergency Services Building Committee received two extremely generous \$50,000 anonymous donations totaling \$100,000. These donors are challenging Elma, the community members served by Elma Emergency Services and the surrounding communities to rally together to match the \$100,000 by December 31, 2022.
